David M. Seymour was born and raised in London, England. He completed his LLB at the Polytechnic at the South Bank in 1986 and his LLM at the London School of Economics and Political Science in 1988. He was awarded a PhD in 1999 from the Department of Sociology at Warwick University. His doctoral thesis, *Critical Theories of Antisemitism*, was supported with the assistance of an ESRC award.

David has written extensively on the subject of Critical Theory's engagement with antisemitism and the Holocaust, including a monograph, *Law, Antisemitism and the Holocaust*, published by Routledge-Glasshouse in 2007. His more recent work focuses on the misappropriation of Holocaust memory within antisemitic narratives. He is currently engaged in an extended project offering a critique of the thought and legacy of Carl Schmitt within contemporary political thought. He has also published critical works centred on the cinematic representations of law.

David has taught at Middlesex Polytechnic, The University of Central England and the University of East London. He is now works at Lancaster University. He is currently an Honorary Research Fellow at the Pears Institute for the Study of Antisemitism at Birkbeck College, the University of London.
