

Prof. Shulamit Reinharz

Prof. Shulamit Reinharz is founding Director of the Women's Studies Research Center and the Hadassah-Brandeis Institute at Brandeis University, and holder of the Jacob Potofsky Chair of Sociology, Reinharz has published 11 books including "The JGirls' Guide" (Jewish Lights), "American Jewish Women and the Zionist Enterprise" (University Press of New England), "Observing the Observer: Understanding Our Selves in Field Research" (Oxford, 2010), Today I am a Woman (Indiana University Press), One Hundred Years of Kibbutz Life (Transaction). and dozens of articles.

She is the recipient of multiple awards and honors, including the Norman Fund for Faculty Research and Creative Projects (2008, 2007); the Jewish Funds for Justice for promoting social justice (2006); an alternate in the Koret International National Jewish Book Award for "The JGirl's Guide" (2006); REACH, an advocacy organization concerned with domestic violence (2005); and the YWCA of Boston for her leadership. She is on the editorial board of 10 academic journals.

Reinharz was born in Amsterdam, grew up in New Jersey, received her B.A. from Barnard College and her Ph.D. from Brandeis University. She was on the faculty of the University of Michigan for 10 years.. She currently is writing "A Memoir in Four Hands: Understanding My Father's Holocaust Experience in Germany and Holland."
