Uta Larkey is Associate Professor of German Studies, the Director of the German program and affiliate faculty of the Judaic Studies program at Goucher College in Baltimore, Maryland. She is also the Director of Goucher College's study abroad program in German language and German film in Berlin. She has received several research grants and fellowships. She has been a Fellow at the Holocaust Educational Foundation, a David Baumgardt Fellow at the Leo Baeck Institute in New York, and a Fellow at the Schusterman Center for Israel Studies at Brandeis University. As a scholar-in-residence at the Hadassah Brandeis Institute, a Research Center at Brandeis University, she has been pursuing her most recent research project entitled *Shared Memories in Holocaust Survivor Families* as part of the HBI project *Families, Children and the Holocaust*. She has presented her research at international and national conferences and seminars, and has published several articles.

Uta Larkey teaches a wide variety of courses in German, Jewish, Holocaust and Film Studies, including an Oral History/Storytelling course on the Holocaust. She has co-authored the book "Life and Loss in the Shadow of the Holocaust: A Jewish Family's Untold Story" (Cambridge University Press, 2011).
